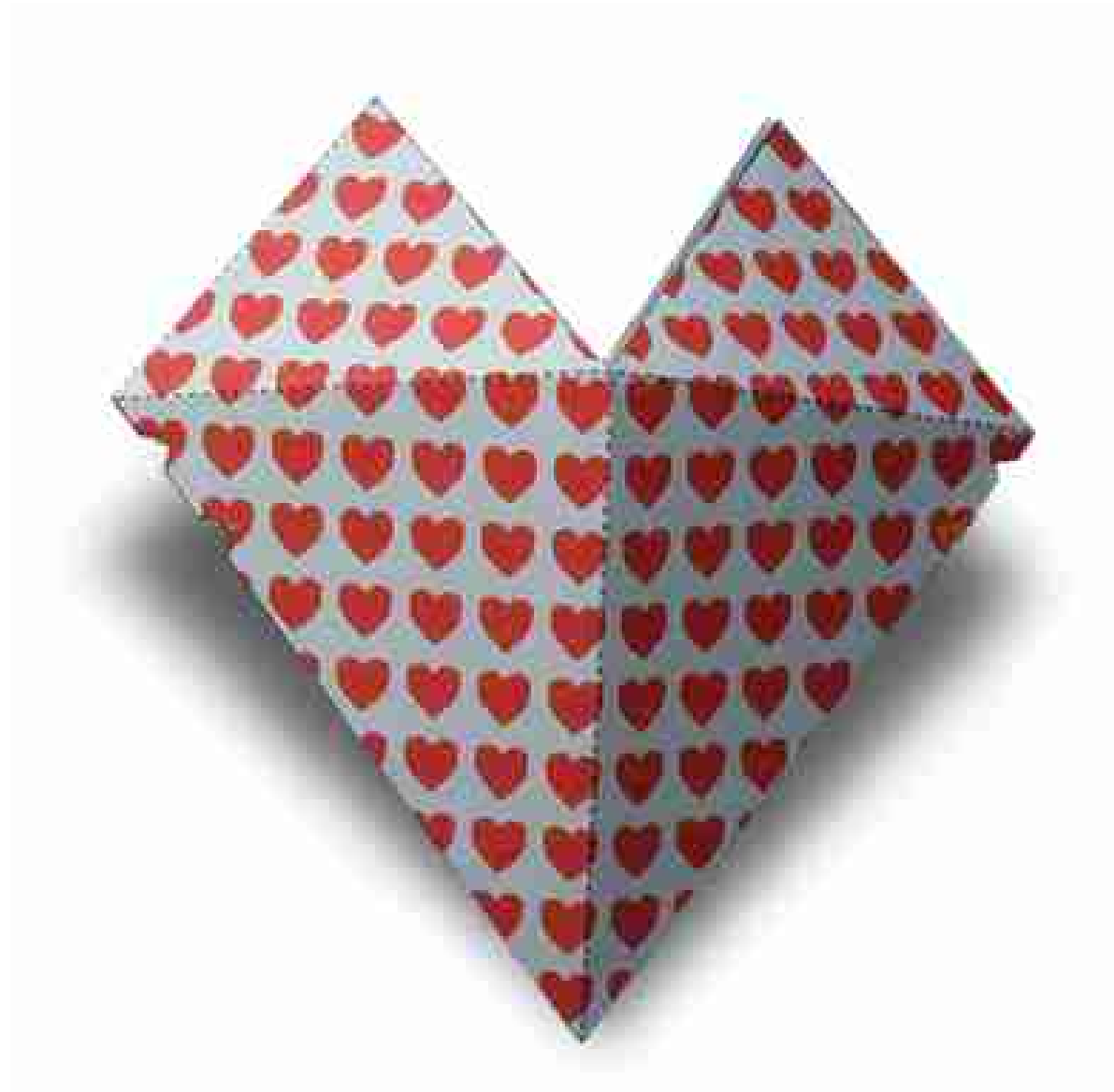


Snap-Up Heart

Snap-Up Heart



Cut out the four small triangles on either side of the heart. These make holes for the elastic band to pass through.

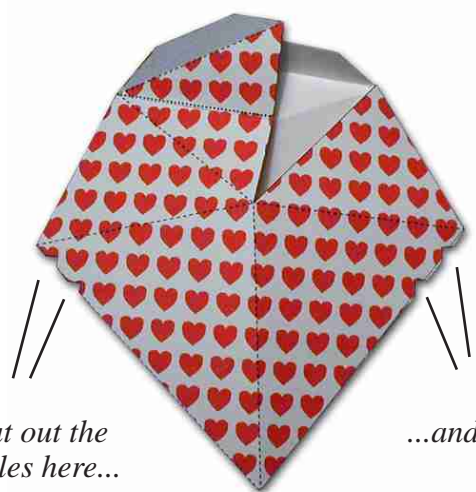
First things first...

You will need a ruler, a pair of scissors, some glue, (white PVA of the type used as a woodwork adhesive is best) and a long thin elastic band.

Print out the pieces of the heart on fairly thick card. We used 280micron pulp board.

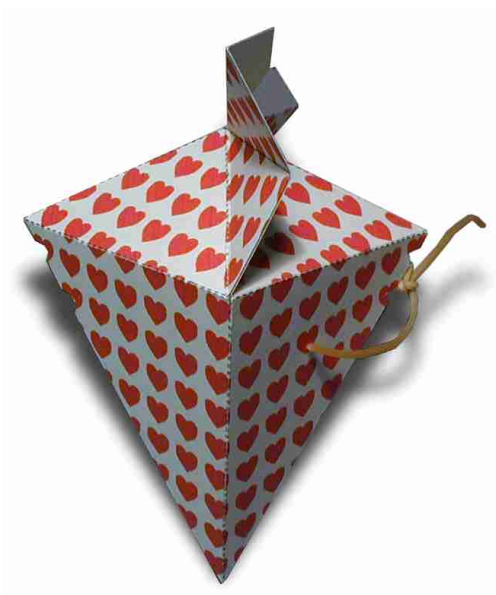
Score along all the dotted lines then cut the two pieces out.

Fold along all the dotted lines to make the heart flexible, then glue down the three flaps A, B and C



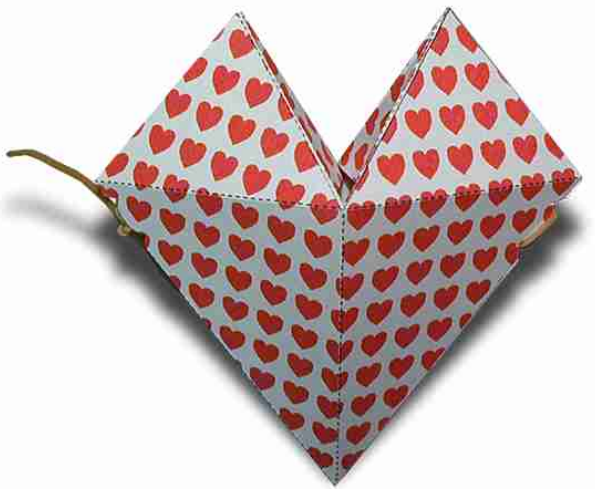
Cut out the holes here...

...and here.



The Elastic Band.

Cut the elastic band so that it makes a single length of elastic. Thread both ends through the holes on one side of the heart and out through the holes on the other side. Pull them tight enough to close the top of the heart then tie them with a double knot.

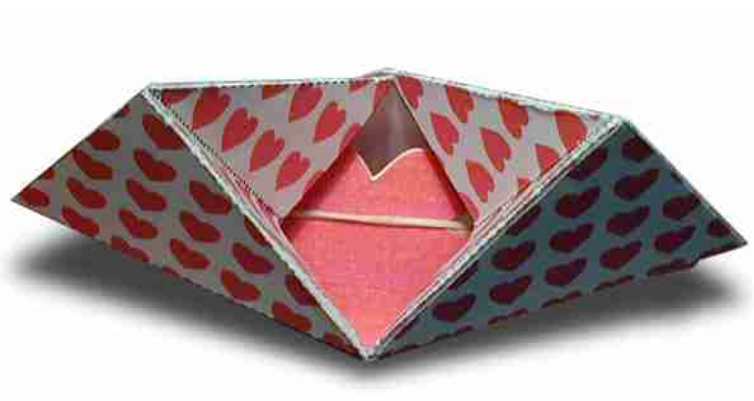


Fold the last two flaps into place and glue them down making sure that the dotted lines are valley folds. Hold the heart flat until the glue has completely dried.



Flutter!

Fold the small heart in half and glue it together. Once the glue has dried carefully cut it out.



Last bit!

This bit is a little tricky; think of it as a demonstration of love!
Slide the flutter between the two strands of the elastic band and carefully wind it up. Keep the heart flat and slip it inside a book or greetings card. When the card is opened the heart will pop out and the flutter will spin inside the heart making your love's heart flutter in delight!
